Course Description

Abstract vector spaces: subspaces, dimension theory. Linear mappings: kernel, image, dimension theorem, isomorphisms, matrix of a linear transformation. Change of basis, invariant subspaces, direct sums, cyclic subspaces, Cayley-Hamilton theorem. Inner product spaces, orthogonal transformations, orthogonal diagonalization, quadratic forms, positive definite matrices. Complex operators: Hermitian, unitary and normal. Spectral Theorem. Isometries of R² and R³. [36L,12T]

Prerequisite: MAT102H5, 223H5 Exclusion: MAT248Y5 (SCI) Distribution Requirement: SCI

Students who lack a pre/co-requisite can be removed at any time unless received explicit waiver from department.
